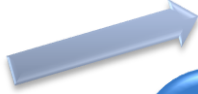


# USING THE NATIONAL WORK READINESS CREDENTIAL (NWRC)



## Determine if your student would benefit from the NWRC

One or more of the following applies to your student

- They are seeking an entry level position
- They are new to the workforce

## Help your student prepare for and get on the NWRC path

- Explain to your student what the NWRC is and how it could benefit them in their job search

## Refer your student to a test site

- Ensure you have purchased NWRC test vouchers. Vouchers are purchased from Steck Vaughn by calling their Customer Service at 1-800-289-4490
- Once you have vouchers from Steck Vaughn you must do one of the following:
  - If you are a test site, you must register the students for exam through CastleWorldWide <http://castleworldwide.com/nwrc>
  - If you are not a test site, provide the student's information and test voucher number to the test proctor
